Speakers came from the Children's' Society, the West Midlands Violence Reduction Unit and Blue Bear Coffee company. The latter is a small company which sources its coffee from independent farmers across the world and invests its profits to support organisations fighting to end human trafficking. The number of people attending was disappointing but such an important topic will no doubt be aired again. Debbie is now getting out about visiting churches and groups with her Awareness sessions. Get in touch with her if you want her to speak to your group.

I hope some of you may have been participating in the 'Re-imagining MU' sessions. If you have, your feedback is important and will be used to shape the future of Mothers' Union. The paperwork was sent out to Council members but, if you haven't had it and would like to take part, please email the office and it will be sent out to you. Feedback by the end of November please.

Reflection for November 2021

My Dear Friends, Greetings in the name of our Lord.

The Time for Transformation is -NOW. This is the theme for 2022 and how appropriate it is. It feels like we have all been holding our breath for a long time as the pandemic, which of course is not yet over, held us all in a state of uncertainty. I know many of you will still be feeling worried and anxious about mixing with others, and that is understandable. But I know how fortunate we are in the UK compared to our sisters and brothers in other parts of the world who are still not able to access any form of vaccine. I am sure like me you hold people in prayer, please continue to do so, particularly in this month of November when we remember especially those who are suffering domestic abuse, something which has been even more prevalent during the last two years. Did you know 1 in 3 people throughout the world suffer in this way. The Time for Transformation is –NOW. Let's not wait until the 1st January to start that transformation but join in with others, who are working hard to irradicate any form of domestic abuse, by taking part in the MU Global Day planned for 27th November as part of the 16 Days of Activism. There are three ways to join 1, join in any event planned by your dioceses, 2, join in any event planned by your deanery or branch, 3, join in at home by wearing a purple scarf as you pray with you family or even alone. Most of you will by now have received the second addition of 'Connected' which includes the special 'Prayer Diary' for the 16 days, which has all that you need to pray along with us. Transforming is something which our heavenly Father is always helping us to do. He transforms our lives by making us strong in our faith, which in turn enables us to make others strong in theirs. He enables us to lead by example just as Jesus led by example as he went about his ministry. When choosing his disciples, he chose men from many walks of life from humble fishermen to tax collectors and transformed their lives. We have a chance to transform the Mothers' Union to make it fit for purpose in the 21st century.

During the last 2 years some excellent work has been done by members from making scrubs for the local hospital to supplying items of food for food banks and clothing for refugees and many things in between.

But now we need to regrow the membership, using this year's theme of Rebuilding Hope & Confidence. As branches begin to meet face to face once again, we need to encourage those members who may still feel unsure to once again become part of the whole. Even as Indoor Members we can still pick up the phone or send a card of encouragement, we can still pray for each other because God has given us so many blessings and so much to thank him for. As I write I have the words of a children's hymn going round and round in my head. The words are: - Jesus' love is very wonderful, Jesus' love is very wonderful. Jesus' love is very wonderful. So high you can't get over it, so low you can't under it, so wide you can't get round it. Oh, wonderful love. There are more verses but I think just these words are enough to show that with such wonderful love to guide us we will be able to act and pray with hope and confidence as we look to transforming the MU because the time to do so is NOW.
