Dear friends and fellow members of Mothers' Union

Well, whatever happened to January?? Belated new year greetings to you all. I hope that you have all stayed safe and well and also were able to spend some much needed time with family and friends.

Now that the hours of daylight are increasing and we have had some beautiful days of sunshine it is easier to be more optimistic about the future in spite of the very windy weather some areas of the diocese have experienced this week. It is good to feel more comfortable about meeting and worshipping together, although there is still reason to be cautious about it.

We are, of course, at the start of a new triennium, the period of three years for which the elected trustees, both diocesan and worldwide, serve. There is much to do and a great deal of planning involved and more details will emerge over time. We hope to be able to reintroduce members' gatherings, perhaps on a fairly informal 'coffee morning' type format, where we can share ideas for projects, working together to meet many of the needs we know are out there in our communities.

From Julia Collinson, General Trustee

As the coronavirus vaccination programme progresses at pace, I think we are all really looking forward to meeting up again and excited to be entering the new Triennial with hope for future. I was very disappointed that the Re-imagining Mothers' Union Conference was cancelled at the last minute but given the magnitude of the infection in those early days of January in was the right decision and I have been told it will be re-scheduled as soon as possible. Thank you all so much for the reports you sent me regarding how you would like to see Mothers' Union moving forward in the future. There were lots of things you would like to keep but also lots of new innovative ideas put forward and I think there will be some very interesting discussions when the conference does take place.

Katherine May and I between us boxed up and posted just under 2000 of the lovely cards you wrote for the prisoners. We were asked to have them delivered by the first of December because if they arrived any later than that they may not be given out as clergy do not go into the Prisons on a weekly basis. We have not been able to hand deliver cards for the last two years because of the Covid restrictions imposed on us by the Prisons. Hopefully next year the restrictions will be lifted, and we can deliver in person as I know some of you consider this as a part of your outreach into the community.

We have been approached by the charity "Children Heard and Seen" to see if we could help to deliver parcels to families in our area who have a family member in Prison. "Children Heard and Seen" is a Charity that works to mitigate the effect having a parent in prison has on children and young people. Children in these circumstances are often more at risk of developing mental health issues, depression and insomnia. We will need to investigate the possibilities further and report back.

I am looking forward to meeting up at the Cathedral for the Commissioning Service.
