Dear friends and members

The last newsletter went out just before Easter and here we are at Ascension Day! Where did those weeks go? I hope that you have been able to enjoy some Spring sunshine recently although we do seem to have to put up with some heavy showers as well! The recent weeks have been busy, including a visit to High Leigh Conference Centre to meet with 30 other Diocesan Presidents and Trustees from Canterbury Province. Some dioceses have no president and are working on a committee basis and others are blessed with a full complement of trustees and officers. However, we all are faced with the same problems of branches closing and the difficulty of communicating effectively with all members. Two members who are part of the Steering Committee for this developing aspect of work, gave brave and moving accounts of their own experience of being a victim of coercive behaviour, one form of domestic abuse. I know that many branches support refuges and I think there will be resources produced to enable us to do more in this area.

I am sure many of you are planning events to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of our Patron, her Majesty the Queen. We give thanks for her dedication and long reign and pray for good weather for all the street parties and events happening everywhere! There are resources, bunting etc, on the central website for this and the Summer of Hope which is focussing on inspirational women in leadership. One last event to let you know about – on Friday 27th May there will a service for 'Thy Kingdom Come' at 2.00pm, live streamed on central Mothers' Union Facebook and YouTube. The service sheet is also on the website.
