May I also ask if you would consider increasing the number of cards you send this year so that we can meet the demand. Thank you.

A gentle reminder that cards should not feature children and the wording inside the card must read "With love and prayers from Mothers' Union".

Thank you for your generosity in providing the cards - they may be the only card that some prisoners receive. Thank you too for the books received for the prison visitor centre. There are enough in stock now but we shall let you know if/when more are needed. We are still waiting for some more information regarding the suitability of toys for one of the other visitors' centres.


Autumn Gathering

News From Tutbury Branch

During the outbreak of disorder around the country this summer, Tutbury MU reached out in support of Police Officers in our community. Wendy Rees's late husband, Rev Les Rees, was Police Chaplain at Burton on Trent. No-one has replaced him yet.

Wendy visits with gifts at Christmas and Easter to keep a Christian presence. She is a member of the Christian Police Association and, as a Friend of "Good News For Everyone" Bible organisation (formerly Gideons International UK), has taken them pocket size New Testaments with their own Staffordshire Constabulary Badge on the front.



As a gesture of support from Tutbury MU she took a prayer card, and a copy of a version of The Police Officer's Prayer to Burton Police Station, to protect them. The members had already begun to pray this together on our WhatsApp chat. At the same time, she delivered

At the same time, she delivered tins of chocolates for those holding the fort, as well as for "the troops" being deployed to Tamworth and Stoke and other trouble spots.

They were both surprised and touched by our response, and grateful for this "evidence" of community spirit in their midst.

As a result, we are going to continue to befriend our police family and include them in our prayers. We give thanks for this new opportunity that arose out of a difficult and dangerous time for many, but prayers were answered.
