Dear members and friends



A gentle reminder that cards should not feature children and the wording inside the card must read "*With love and prayers from Mothers' Union*".

Thank you for your generosity in providing the cards - they may be the only card that some prisoners receive.

Thank you too for the books received for the prison visitor centre. There are enough in stock now but we shall let you know if/when more are needed.

The 2023 Annual Review of work done by Mothers' Union Worldwide is now available on the central website: mothersunion.org.
