Dear members and friends

The end of 2024 marks the end of an era for me. I have been on the Trustee Board of Mothers' Union in our Diocese of Lichfield since January 2010, having been Gift Aid Secretary for a couple of years when Ann Hodkinson was both Treasurer and Finance & Admin Coordinator. I served first as F & A Coordinator for two terms then Lichfield Archdeaconry Leader in 2016 through to 2020 when I became Interim Diocesan President following the untimely death of our dear friend Sue. That role then became 'official' when elections were held in 2021 and you very kindly gave me your support to carry on. I owe a great deal to all those I have served with as fellow trustees, as well as learning from past diocesan presidents Joan and Liz as well as Sue, not forgetting Jean and Rosemary who presided before I was a trustee.

There have been many changes over the years and many challenges, especially over recent years. Membership has fallen and branches closed although, in many cases, members still meet informally without the constraints of the branch structure, although that brings its own challenges. In 2010 membership in the diocese was around 2,000 with Great Britain and Ireland around 100,000. Our membership therefore 2% of the GB & I. There are now around 38,000 in GB & I of which around 750 are in this diocese, just under 2%. We are just about holding our own, but our universal problem in this country is attracting members who are the age we were when most of us became Mothers' Union members! We have to accept that life for families has changed in the intervening years and must adapt to attract and recruit the members of the future. With the 150th Anniversary of Mothers' Union coming up in 2026 some ambitious targets have been issued by central MU, more of which will be circulated in due course.

As you know, Deb is taking up the baton as your new Diocesan President and new trustees Kate, Adie, Jo, Sue and Megan are joining her on the Board of Trustees. Please keep them all in your prayers. I give thanks to Celia, Julia and Katherine for their hard work and support as trustees over recent years.

But it may not a total goodbye as all of us are hoping that we may be able to continue with some aspect of MU work, with the agreement of the new board and your support! Celia has offered to retain the role of treasurer for another year, with Adrian continuing to carry out all day-to-day matters of finance.

It has been a privilege to serve Mothers' Union in this Diocese, first as a trustee, then your Diocesan President. As I said there have been challenges - and still some to come - but we have been a good team and worked together to overcome them. But none of it would have been possible without the support of you, our members and friends, and your hard work, not forgetting that essential support, your prayers.

Thank you for everything. I wish you all a blessed Christmas, stay warm, stay safe. My love and prayers to you all
